

# ‘Wolf Jaws’



Thank you for purchasing a set of the Wolf Jaws bowholder. You will now be able to insert your bow into your Lone Wolf treestand with confidence. Please follow the instructions carefully for the correct assembly and use of your Wolf Jaws with your particular bow.

You must use a rubber bowholder grommet (BHG) when using the Wolf Jaws.

Use plate “B” on top of the stand when using older bows without strings and when using non-parallel limb bows.

Place 2 – 1 ½” bolts upward through Plate “A” and place under stand. Place Top Plate “B” in stand and allow the bolts to come through. Place lock nuts on bolts and finger tighten. Place your bow in the holder and adjust the Wolf Jaws forward and back to get the best performance for your bow. Generally, if the top plate overhangs the built in opening ¼” to 3/8” it will be best.

Complete Parts

For Matthews String Suppressor Bows, Hoyt, Bowtech, and other parallel limb bows.....

To reduce confusion, the term “front” refers to the part of the stand away from the tree.

Left and right will be determined as you are sitting on the stand looking toward the holder.

The word “opening” describes the built in bowholder opening on the Lone Wolf stand.

The plates attach to the rear side of the opening.

Picture 1 is looking down from the top.

Picture 2 is looking up from the bottom.

Picture 3 shows a proper set-up with a Drenalin in place.

Picture 4 shows the set-up for a Guardian. Use a knife to cut out marked line(see pic below) for the Guardian.



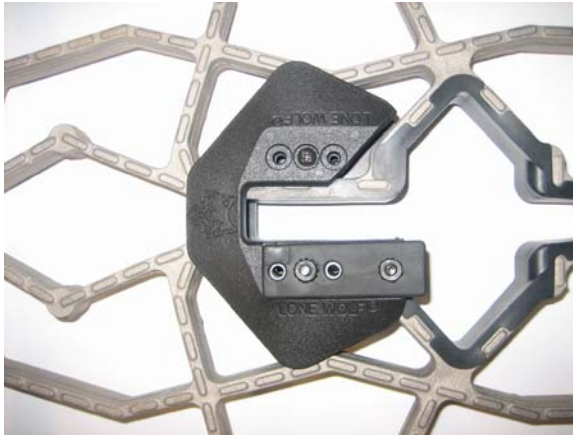
These are right handed instructions. For left handed instructions simply flip top plate “A” over with the smooth side up.

First, be sure to attach the four hole limb catch plate to plate “A” with 3/4” bolt before proceeding.

Put the 1 3/4” bolt up through the front hole on the right side of plate “B”. Put the 1 1/2” bolt through the left center hole. Place this plate underneath the stand with the bolts pointing up. Now, drop plate “A” onto the bolts using the 2<sup>nd</sup> hole from the front on the right side and the center hole on the left side.

Before tightening, adjust the holder so that the bottom plate “B” is flush with the back of the opening (white arrow in Picture 1). If this plate sticks forward off the edge, it will be more difficult to insert the bow.

Top Plate “A” should also be flush with the same edge of the opening as well as the side (Picture 1 and 2 white arrows). Only about 5/16” of the four hole limb catch should hang forward over the edge of the opening. This is the part that will catch the bow limb.

Additional tricks to fine tune.....

When adjusting the placement of the Wolf Jaws, if you are right handed slide the plates over to the left so that the right side of the plate slots are flush with the right side of the opening. This will create more stability for your bow.

With some of the more parallel limb bows you may need to apply a piece of moleskin or electrical tape to the very top, front of the stand where the limb may be in contact with the metal.

You may find with your particular bow model that by placing the bolts through different holes in the plates you will get better performance. Experiment with bolt placement to make the Wolf Jaws work best for your set-up.
